OFFICE: Victims of Crime Office is to support the development of competent, caring and efficient services to victims of crime, by state agencies and non-governmental organisations throughout the country.

The Commission for the Support of Victims of Crime is an independent body which operates under the aegis of the Department of Justice and Law Reform. It provides funding for voluntary sector organisations supporting victims of crime

NOTES: No specific service for victims of terrorism. The Justice Office is a central office of the state, controlled by the Minister for Justice, consisting of the Central Justice Office, and 20 regional offices (one regional office in the capital and 19 other regional offices in the county seats). The departments responsible for protection of victims' interests are Victim Support Service, Legal Aid Service and Probation Service.

There is a Crime Victims Helpline that gives information support services in the local area for the victim, about specialist services for victims of particular crime and about the criminal justice system and information on how to look for compensation.
